

HOME STAGING CHECKLIST

The following checklist is provided for agents and homeowners to help prepare for their shoot. Items to be hidden can be moved to closets or areas not to be photographed. It is not the photographer's responsibility to clean or straighten the home.

INTERIOR

Ensure all light fixtures and bulbs work properlyTurn every single light ON
Declutter the house as much as possible
Hang towels on towel bars
Add or remove artwork
Set dining table nicely
Remove toilet covers
Remove rugs (unbroken floor space increases perceived square footage
☐ Clean all window, glass, and counters☐ Dust EVERYTHING
☐ Remove cobwebs
☐ Curtains freshened
 Open all window blinds and curtains; let as much light in as possible
Refrigerator free of magnets, pictures, fingerprints
☐ Bedrooms tidy and beds made
☐ Walk-in closets tidy with nicely hung clothing, floors cleared
☐ Hide (out of sight)
☐ Trashcans
□ Cleaning supplies
☐ Magazines
□ Books
□ Coffeemakers (etc)
☐ Tissue boxes
☐ Family photos (etc)
☐ Remove or fix broken decorations
☐ Hide exposed power cords
☐ Turn OFF
□ Ceiling fans
□ Computer Screens
☐ Televisions
☐ Garage
☐ No vehicles
☐ Clean and decluttered
☐ As much off the floor as possible
